

Additional reasons for being Affiliated:

- Potential Partners/Funders/Insurers are provided with the assurance that your Club receives assistance from a National Governing Body to which you can obtain assistance and guidance on matters relating to the Governance and day to day running of your Club.
- The EIBA support Clubs who are facing the threat of closure due to landlords looking to use the facility for other activities. This has achieved a change of mind and or ensured that a new facility includes an indoor bowls facility.

MEMBERSHIP

Each Member Club/Member County shall pay such Annual Subscription as may be determined by an ordinary resolution of the Members at the Annual General Meeting.

Each Member Club shall in addition pay a levy in respect of each of their playing members who have attained the age of **18 years** of such amount as may be determined by an ordinary resolution of the Members at the Annual General Meeting

A "playing member" for the purposes of the Levy is regarded as any person entitled by virtue of his or her membership to use the indoor playing facilities of the Club.

For the 2025/2026 Season the following monies are currently payable:

- (i) For the 12 months ending 30th November 2026, the Levy payable by each Club in respect of each of their playing members (who have attained the age of 18 years) as at 1st December 2025, shall be £5.00 this sum to be paid by 31st December 2025
- (ii) For the 12 months ending 30th November 2026, the Annual Subscription for Clubs shall be £136.50, this sum to be paid by 31st December 2025.
