PRICE RISES TO THE CHALLENGE

Women's Over 60 Pairs

Mary Price showed she still has the skill and killer instinct that made her one of the world's top women bowlers, when she skipped her Desborough (Maidenhead) clubmate Eileen Devonald-Batt to the national women's over 60 pairs title in Nottingham today (THU).

A great exponent of the outdoor game, her greatest successes indoors came when she won the English women's indoor singles title three times (in 1985, 1991 and 1994), but she insists she has never stopped believing that she had another national title in her.

Receiving good support from Devonald-Batt, Price, who is 72, played superbly on her way to the final, and delivered what turned out to be a match-winning bowl on the 16th end of a fascinating encounter with Elsie Elvin and Carole Baker, from the Norfolk Bowls Club in Norwich.

The Desborough duo surged into an 8-1 lead after seven ends, but a profitable mid-game spell enabled Elvin and Baker to get their noses in front for the first time at 12-11 after 15 ends, and the Norfolk pair looked as if they might take control when they held six shots on the 16th.

Price, who won the WIBC women's world title in Guernsey in 1991, and has served as England's team manager indoors and out, dipped into her vast repertoire, and ditched the jack to claim three shots, and the Buckinghamshire duo, who were back in front, 14-12, went on to win, 20-13.

This morning, Desborough defeated Sue Evans and Di Routley, from Taunton Deane, 22-14, while the Norfolk pair proved to be too good for Catherine King and Jan Roberts, from Exmouth Madeira, beating the Devon duo, 22-15.

A 'FIRST' FOR BEDFORD BOROUGH

Men's Over 60 Pairs

Mark Curtis and Graham White, from the Bedford Borough club, won the national men's over 60 indoor pairs title when they defeated Welford-on-Avon's Anglo-Italian partnership of Mario Rosso and Bill Ward, 20-17, in a final that was a classic game of two halves.

Curtis and White looked certain winners when they opened up a 16-3 lead over the first 13 ends, but Rosso, who was born in Italy, and Ward proved to be stubborn opponents, and scored ten shots to one over the next five ends to close the gap to just four shots at 17-13.

On the 19th end, the Welford pair were holding shots when White achieved a crucial turnover, and the treble gave the Bedford pair some breathing space - though Rosso and Ward defiantly finished with a single and a treble to make the score respectable at 20-17.

Bedford Borough boasts a splendid club with indoor and outdoor greens, and a proud history - but, although they won the national men's outdoor pairs title through David Hurst and John McConnell in 1982, this was their first national success on carpet since the indoor green was opened in 1971.

In this morning's semi finals, the 'Bedford Boys' beat Charlie Bailey and Barry Starks, from Portsmouth's Victory club, 22-14, and Welford-on-Avon put an end to the fairytale run of Andy Sayer and Richard Bunton, from the Lynnsport club in King's Lynn.

Over 60 inter-club Double Rink championships

What a coup for the spin doctors who want Sport England to recognise that bowls, while not being the proverbial Old Man's Game, is actually a great sport for senior citizens, providing beneficial physical exercise, an outlet for their competitive urges, and a valuable source of social interaction.

Thirty two men and thirty two women from eight different clubs - Boston (Lincs), MidGlos (Brockworth), Essex County (Southend-on-Sea), Taunton Deane (Somerset), Nottingham, Tye Green (Harlow), West Berks (Newbury) and Adur (Southwick, near Brighton) - thronged on to the green to do battle in the semi finals of the national over 60 inter-club Double Rink championships.

So - who survived to compete in tomorrow's finals? - In the women's event, Essex County steamrollered Taunton Deane, 42-19, the Somerset side throwing in the towel with eight possible ends left to play, and Boston edged home by five shots, 44-39, against MidGlos.

In the men's semi finals, Nottingham's home advantage must have been a factor in their 43-32 win over Tye Green, while West Berks defeated Adur, 47-37.
