Advice on had weather conditions

When playing in National Competitions we suggest that competitors should be fair and sensible and play matches when it is safe and possible to do so for both teams.

It is preferred that matches are played on or by the original dates or soon after. If matches have to be cancelled please liaise with your opponent and play by the next round date where possible.

Please also take into account that the next opponent may be waiting to play.

CIVIL LIABILITY INSURANCE

Ordinary playing members of EIBA member clubs are unlikely to require separate Professional Indemnity insurance, as they are not engaged in formal coaching activities.

Bowlers participating in EIBA club activities are insured for their legal liabilities for injury or damage under the EIBA scheme policy. This liability cover extends to include "member to member" liability.

For the directors and officers of the clubs themselves cover can be extended to include Directors and Officers liabilities to provide protection against wrongful acts. In brief clubs arranging their insurance through the EIBA scheme will enjoy a comprehensive range of cover including their legal liabilities for injury or damage to third parties or other members. Coaches engaged at those clubs, if members of EBCS, have the added protection of Professional Indemnity (Errors and Omissions) insurance provided by their professional body.

Considering the above only those clubs who need to purchase "stand alone" liability insurance, perhaps because they do not play from their own premises, and are not eligible for the full cover of the EIBA scheme policy should consider arranging separate Civil Liability insurance.
